We will however be allowing some non members to attend after 8th January. This is a soft opening for the public and we won't be advertising it to the broader public at this time.

Also please be aware that they are always subject to change at very short notice depending on the government making changes to the public health orders.

As you probably noticed the styling of Matters has changed from previous issues. I hope everyone likes the new style. There will probably be a few more changes in the coming issues, once the club starts to ramp up operations and are back to pre covid levels, and there is more things to report on.

The committee is already working on the planning of quite a few exciting activities for 2022 and once all this pandemic stuff is behind us it should turn out to be a very exciting year around the club.

Additional Opening Days for the Clubrooms

Current Requirements for Attending the clubrooms

For anyone wishing to attend the clubrooms the following protocols are to be followed at all times. Please check at the clubrooms for any changes to these as the situation can change with very short notice.

- * You must be fully vaccinated and show proof of this when asked.
- You must pre-book your attendance for the day you wish to attend. Bookings open each Saturday for the following week. Bookings can be made by scanning the QR code below or by using the link.

- * You must check-in using the Service NSW QR code on arrival.
- * Masks must be worn at all times whilst in the clubrooms except when eating or drinking.
- * Only 3 people are to sit at any table at the same time. 1 person in the middle of 1 side, and 1 person at each end of the opposite side.

These protocols have been put in place as part of our Covid safe plan as required by NSW Public Health Orders.

Please remember the health & safety of our members is the number 1 priority for the committee and this is always at the front of any process implemented.
