Prototype Operation Group - POG

Back in the Rockdale days, there was a small special interest group that would meet to use the HO layout on the 4th Sunday of the month. The group would operate the layout to within an inch of its life. There was not a piece of track on the layout that would not get used.

The premise of the group was to operate a timetable in a NSW prototypical way. With the move to Mortdale and the subsequent lack of operational layout for a considerable amount of time the group fell into an extended hiatus. With Stoney Creek now at a state of reliable operation and with 99% of the trackwork laid and operational, some of the old crew are looking to bring POG out of hiatus.

The committee has already agreed in principal to POG recommencing operation and just need a formal request in line with the Special Interest Group framework. The provisional day for the group to meet will be 2nd Sunday of each month.

It is hoped to be able to hold the 1st meeting in the next 2-3 months. If this sounds like something you are interested in please let Damien George know and he will gladly give you all the details.

Exhibition Update

There were multiple factors that were considered when going through the decision making process. Uncertainty of restrictions at the time of critical timeline milestones, availability of volunteers for the weekend with other events taking a significant number of members away from AMRA, and also the financial situation of the branch.

As with most of the world, AMRA NSW has not come through the pandemic unscathed, and to hold an exhibition to the size and stature that we would normally hold would put a massive strain on the club bank account that the COM was not prepared to do.

In lieu of an exhibition this year, we will be holding at least 1 open day at the clubrooms. The date set for this is Sunday 9th October. This may even turn into a 2 day event. We are looking at getting a commercial exhibitor or 2 and hopefully a feature layout.

Discussions have already started around holding an exhibition in 2023 and what form that may take. All possibilities are on the table including only holding a 2 day event.

East Mateland Upgrade

There are multiple problems on the layout that have impacted the operation and with its age a complete rewire was deemed to be the most suitable & cost effective solution.

As with any layout of the age that East Mateland has reached, the scenery has started to look very tired & has a few battle scars that need attention.

It is hoped that this work can be completed in time for the club open day in October. If you have ever wanted to learn about wiring a layout, laying some track or even building scenery this is the perfect chance for you to learn. Even if you are some what of a subject matter expert in 1 area there's no problem with learning something new.

Current Requirements for Attending the clubrooms

For anyone wishing to attend the clubrooms the following protocols are to be followed at all times. Please check at the clubrooms for any changes to these as the situation can change with very short notice.

- * It is recommended you check-in using the Service NSW QR code on arrival.
- * Masks are recommended to be worn in the clubrooms when social distancing can not be maintained.
- * Only 3 people are to sit at any table at the same time. 1 person in the middle of 1 side, and 1 person at each end of the opposite side.
